# ENGAGING THE WORLD: The Theatrical Experience I Department of Theatre's Season of "Engaging the World"

#### **Course Description:**

This seminar is designed to offer students an in-depth exploration of three shows being performed by the Department of Theatre during fall semester 2009:

- *The American Clock*, by Arthur Miller
- Evil Dead: The Musical, Book and Lyrics by George Reinblatt
- As You Like It, by William Shakespeare

Team-taught by instructors and guest lecturers from the Department of Theatre with expertise in the major aspects of theatre and dance production—acting and directing, design, dance, and dramatic literature—the seminar will allow participants to gain first-hand acquaintance with the collaborate process of theatrical and dance production: from study of the script; to the conception of the production developed by the director, designers, and choreographers; the actors' and dancers' approach to learning their roles; the work of crew and stage managers in mounting the production; and critical appreciation of the final product, the performance itself. Students will have the opportunity to engage individually with directors, choreographers, designers, cast and crew. Three assignments focus on different aspects of the production process.

#### **Course Objectives:**

- To gain an understanding and appreciation of the collaborative nature of theatre and dance production.
- To learn what steps lead from the work of a playwright to the staging of a dramatic production.
- To understand the significance and meaning of three plays.
- To foster appreciation of and excitement about the experience of theatre and dance.

#### Requirements to Receive a "Pass":

- 1. Attendance at scheduled class meetings. You must notify Dr. George Peters (peters@msu.edu) if an emergency makes it impossible for you to attend class. Attendance will be taken.
- 2. Reading of three scripts.
- 3. Attendance at the Thursday evening performance OR Sunday matinee of each of the three shows, including the pre-show director's talk or the post-show symposium. NOTE: If a scheduling conflict makes it impossible for you to attend the designated
